Summary Statement

Monthly and last three months: July and May to July 2026 statement

The rainfall for July and May to July was above normal for the Republic of Naoero. It was the 7th wettest July on record and 6th wettest May to July period.

Part 1i. Monthly and Seasonal Outlooks for September and September to November 2026

Monthly /Seasonal rainfall and temperature Outlook statements

The rainfall for September 2026 is very likely to be above normal

The rainfall for September to November 2026 is also very likely to be above normal for the island.

Maximum and minimum temperatures during September and the average temperature for September to November are very likely to be above normal.

Part 2: Recent Ocean summary statement

Monthly and last three months: July and May to July 2026

July sea surface temperatures (SSTs) around Naoero were 0.4 to 0.8°C above normal.

Averaged over May to July 2026, SSTs were also 0.8 to 1.2°C above normal

July sea levels around Naoero were above normal ranging from 200.0 to 300.0mm.

Coral bleaching around Naoero were on WATCH level on 2nd July 2026.

Part 2i. Monthly and Seasonal Outlooks for September and September to November 2026

Ocean Variable statement

September 2026 sea surface temperatures are predicted to be above normal. However, SSTs averaging from September to November around Naoero are predicted to be above normal.

September 2026 sea levels around Naoero are predicted to be near-normal. For the next 3-month outlook from September to November, sea levels are also predicted to be near-normal.

Coral Bleaching 4-week outlook, Naoero is expecting WARNING coral bleaching as of 24 August 2026.

In brief for Teleconference

- Rainfall was above normal for July and May to July.
- The rainfall outlook generally indicates above normal most likely in September and the next 3month from September to November 2026.
- SSTs were above normal for July and also May to July. SSTs are predicted to be above normal for the next one and three months.
- Sea levels were above normal in July. Sea levels are predicted to be near-normal for the next one- and three-month outlook.
- Coral bleaching: WATCH on 2nd July 2026. WARNING out to 24th August 2026.
